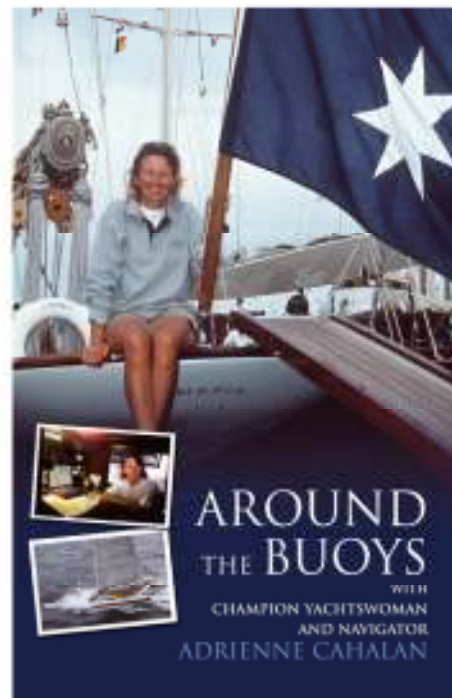

Our guest speaker at the AGM was Ms Molly Croft, past recipient of the OAA NSW Youth Community Service Award. In a very moving address she told the audience of her life story and battle with cancer at a very young age. Molly is a 17 year old who loves sharing her message in the hope of encouraging young people to not be defined by their circumstances, but to always look for a reason to smile. At age 12, Molly was diagnosed with Osteoblastic Osteosarcoma (bone cancer) and has lived between hospitals and her home since. She is a two time osteosarcoma survivor. As President of the Tie Dye Project, Molly has helped raise awareness and in excess of \$550,000 for cancer related causes. Molly is an inspiration to young people and adults alike. Her effervescence and positivity captivates every audience that has the privilege of hearing her speak and we were certainly no exception.

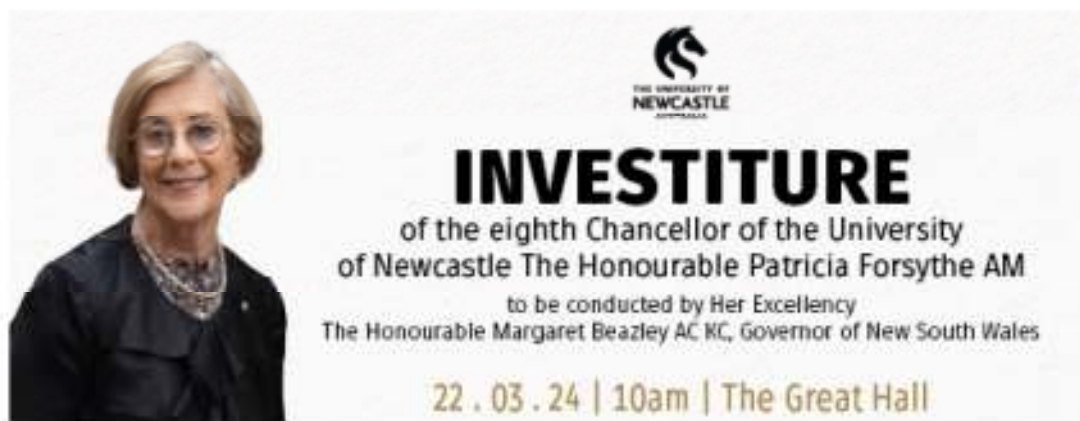
Adrienne Cahalan OAM - *"In Conversation"*

Following the AGM, members and guests enjoyed a luncheon at the Castlereagh Boutique Hotel with special guest speaker "in conversation" with Adrienne Cahalan OAM. Adrienne is an Australian champion yachtswoman, trailblazing navigator, maritime lawyer and Sydney to Hobart racing legend! She is the fastest Australian to circumnavigate the globe in a record 58 days!

She is the first and only female to compete in the Sydney to Hobart race 30 times, six line honours wins and three overall victories. In October 2019, Adrienne was inducted to the Australian Sailing Hall of Fame.
